Pupil Premium: 2011 – 2012

Pupil Premium in 2011 – 12 was additional funding received for students who were receiving Free School Meals at that point in time, for children who had been looked after continuously for more than six months and for children whose parents were recorded as service personnel. This funding is provided as a way of addressing inequalities in educational outcomes and in ensuring that all students can achieve academically. This funding for Trinity School was £54,500 in 2011-12.

The change of the Free School Meals criteria to include all students who have received Free School Meals at any point in the last six years has only been applied by the school since September 2012 and all plans identified for 2011 – 12 were targeted at the original cohort.

Details of how the school used this funding to support these students and increase their success are outlined below:
