#### Shakespeare Schools Festival

Trinity Theatre Company presented a half hour version of 'Othello' at the Queen's Hall Arts Centre in Hexham on Friday 15<sup>th</sup> October. ## Year 7 Cathedral Service – Tuesday 19th October, 2.45 pm

This was a lovely event as ever, with students receiving a New Testament from The Gideons, and we were grateful to Mr W Caunce and his colleagues for being with us for the service of welcome and thanksgiving. Thanks also to the parents and carers who came along to be with us. The collection was taken for the Bishop's Harvest Appeal, and we were glad that Canon Michael Manley could also join us for the service.

#### Remembrance

As we do each 11<sup>th</sup> November, a short ceremony was held in The Creighton entrance where the war memorial and book of remembrance are to the former students of The Creighton School who fell in the Second World War. Year 7 form representatives and the House Captains attended with the headteacher. A wreath was laid. The Sixth Form also held ceremonies at the two other war memorials to the former Grammar School students in the Devonshire Hall. The whole school kept the silence.

Through Asia House, the piper played the lament in school on Friday, and the Last Post was sounded. It was a moving and powerful event and thanks in particular for Mr Hall and Mrs Barwick for organizing it, and to all the students who represented the school so well, and understood the importance of the occasion.

Thanks also go to Mrs Hodgson, the Head of History, who spoke to each House about her research into the stories behind the names on the memorials. You can find some more details about this on the school's website. It is very moving, and brings the big events of twentieth century closer in reach of our students.

#### Remembrance Concert

We held our Autumn concert on Remembrance day this year and we gave it that theme. It included a wide variety of music from sources both old and new, incorporating music from film, dance and song. Some of the pieces were lively and celebratory; others gave chance for a more reflective mood. As the concert was held on Remembrance Day it ended with a selection of wartime songs that the audiences joined in with and the last post as an act of remembrance.

#### Year 10 pathway 3 - Science exams - January

The following classes will be sitting <u>GCSE exams</u> in January. Sets 1 and 2 – Biology unit 1, Chemistry Unit 1 and Physics Unit 1 Sets 3 and 4 – Science Unit 1 and Science Unit 2.

#### Year 11 pathway 3 – Science exams – January

Sets 3 and 4 will be sitting Additional Science exams. <u>Year 11 pathways 1 + 2</u> Students will be sitting Science Unit 2 exams in January.

Revision guides are available priced £3.10 from the school shop.

#### Access Fund

The school has received a grant of over £20,000 to encourage students to participate in extra-curricular activities and clubs. This replaces Cumbria's Access Fund Scheme. This money is for students who receive Free School Meals and is for one year only. Examples include helping towards the costs of educational visits, music tuition, the costs of kit required to participate in a sport and subscriptions for a team. Please ask a House Tutor, Student Manager or Mr Lythgoe if you require further details. A more detailed letter and application form will be sent to all students we know to be eligible for free school meals.

#### Free School Meals

The main qualifying benefits for free school meals are:

- Income Support
- Income Based Job Seekers Allowance
- Child Tax Credit
- The Guarantee Element of the State Pension Credit

You may have heard of the Pupil Premium in the news. We think all schools will receive a block of money depending on how many students claim free school meals. It would really help the school's funding if you applied, even if you have no intention of eating the meals! However, they are of good quality and variety and increasingly competitively priced.

#### Darker evenings

We have been reminding students about safe and sensible behaviour in the coming weeks on their way home from school in particular. We have asked them to make sure that they let you know if they are doing an activity after school, and to make their way home in twos and threes and not on their own. Many students wear dark jackets and something which made them more visible would be very welcome. Lights on bikes, helmets and high-visibility arm bands etc are also being encouraged. A number of high-vis rucksacks have been given out to students, with thanks to Mrs Wylie.

#### At the start and the end of the school day

If you are dropping off or picking up students from the school, please avoid parking on the double yellow lines or the 'School keep clear' markings. The school is particularly busy at either end of the school day. We suggest that you arrange a point some distance from the school where it is safe and legal to stop. We are concerned about the safety of our students who are having to cross Strand Road, or the road by DFS by weaving through parked or even moving cars.

We have made an informal arrangement with DFS that cars may wait in their car park from 3.15 pm until 3.40 pm, to collect students, to avoid the difficulties at the bottom end of Zero Path. We hope that you will be able to pick your children up there.

If you or your child have a mobility issue, please contact us to make a particular arrangement.

#### Boys football

#### Girls Football

**Under 15 team -** The first round of the County Cup saw Trinity awarded a bye to the second round where they faced Queen Katherine. A very strong team performance saw Trinity win the match by an outstanding 10-0 margin! Cora Riley scored a hat-trick. We are waiting to hear who they will play in the quarter final.

The weather was awful and it was dark by the time the match was over. The girls should be very proud of their performance as it was a very close match and they gave it their best.

The second round saw the team travel to play Morton where they again showed their class with a 4-1 win. The team have been drawn against rivals Stainburn in the third round. #### Under 18 team
