

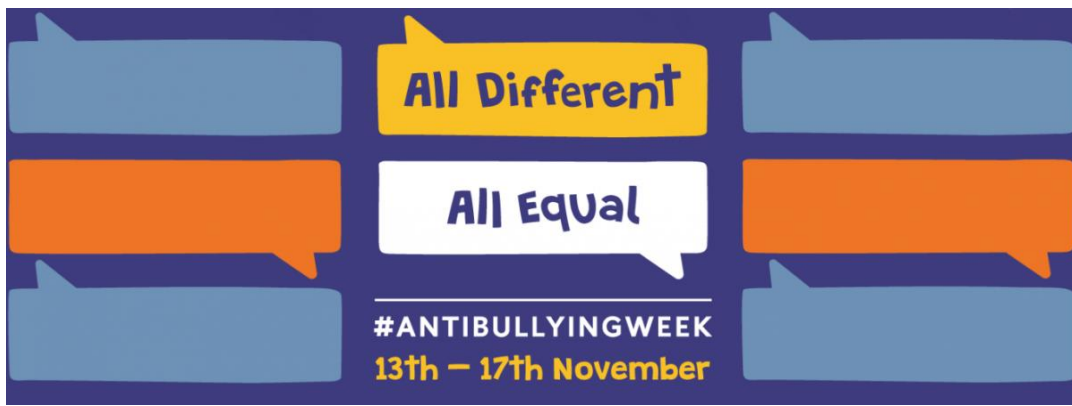

Dining Facilities

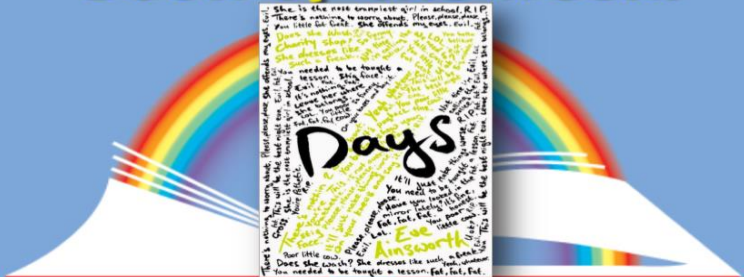
