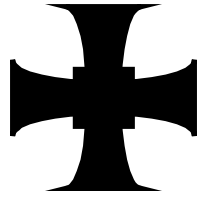

**AN EXPLANATION OF THE PRIZES**

### **SUBJECT PRIZES**

*We award two for each subject in Year 7 and 8, one to a girl and one to a boy, for high standards of effort and achievement during the year.*

### **APPROACH TO LEARNING PRIZES**

*We award two in each form, one to a girl and one to a boy, for a consistently impressive approach to learning across all subjects.*

### **GC ARCHER PRIZES for SERVICE to OTHERS**

*We award these prizes to one student in each House. These are named after Mr Archer, a former deputy headteacher of the Grammar School who left a bequest to endow some prizes in the school. They are awarded to students who have made a significant contribution to the wider life of the school and its community.*

### **THE MARGARET SEWELL PRIZES for SERVICE to OTHERS**

*These prizes are awarded to one student in each House also. They are awarded in honour of Margaret Jane Sewell, after whom part of the school is named. She was a member of Carlisle School Board and devoted her life to the good of others. She was one of the best known female workers in the public life of Carlisle, and her greatest interest was the education and welfare of the young. Miss Sewell died in 1918 in her 62nd year. As with the GC Archer prizes these are awarded to students who have made a significant contribution to the wider life of the school and its community.*

### **HOUSE PRIZES**

*These are awarded to one student from Year 7 and one from Year 8 in each House. The Head of House and House Tutor nominate students who have made an important and positive contribution to the life of the House.*

### **THE VAL TURNBULL AWARDS**

*Val was our librarian for many years and sadly she died in 2013. She loved libraries, and she loved our school libraries. She delighted in books, and in reading and learning, and enjoyed working with students who shared her endless curiosity. We award prizes to two students who have also shown a delight in books and in our library.*

### **The J H DODD AWARD**

*J H Dodd was a student at the Carlisle Grammar School who was awarded this small trophy for Inter – School Sports in 1930. He became an athlete of some renown and national long-jump champion in 1934. The cup was given to the school by his widow in 2008. We award this prize to one student each year who has shown exceptional commitment to inter-school sport.*

### **THE SIMON ARMSTRONG AWARD**

*This prize is awarded to students who have shown they have enriched the life of the school in a significant way. One award is given at Junior Prize Giving, and one at Senior Prize Giving. Simon Armstrong was a student of Trinity School from 1983 until 1990, who sadly died in 2006. The award is made in his honour and with thanks for the dedication of his family to the life of Trinity School.*
