

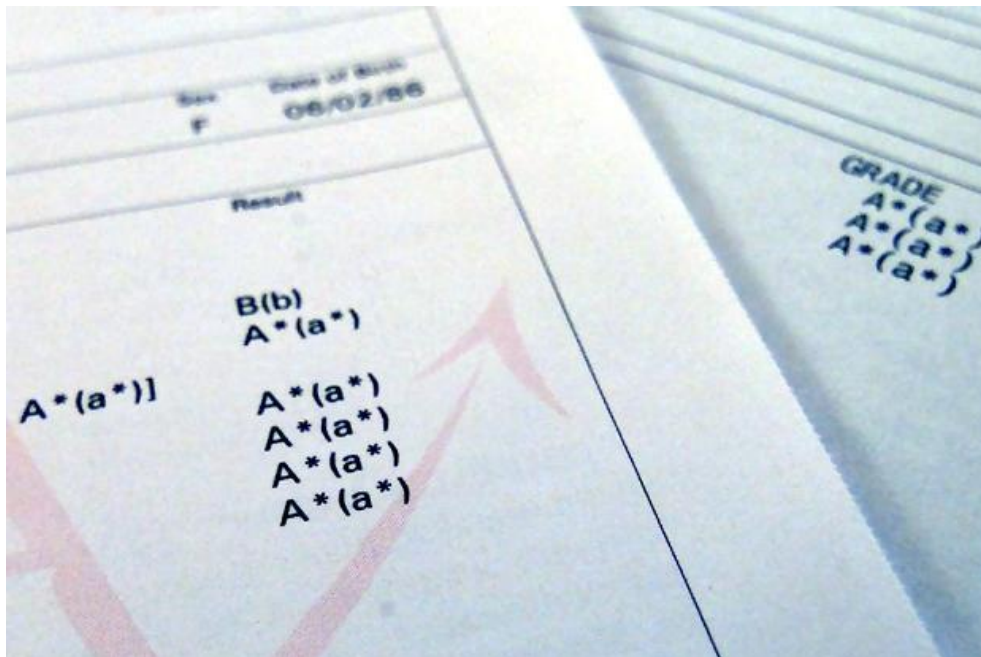

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## AFTER THE EXAMINATIONS

### Notification of Results

#### A Level and Vocational Subjects:

Results will be available in **Jubilee Hall**, via main reception, **from 8:30am on Thursday 18<sup>th</sup> August 2022**.

For those unable to collect in person, if requested in advance, results will be sent electronically **from 11:00am** via email to your **School/chosen email account** on **Thursday 18<sup>th</sup> August 2022**.

Staff will be available in school from **8:30am** to deal with any specific exam / careers related guidance you may require.

#### GCSE:

Results will be available in **Jubilee Hall**, via main reception, **from 8:30am on Thursday 25<sup>th</sup> August 2022**. You will receive an envelope containing a hard copy of the Statement of Results and Awarding Body breakdowns.

For those unable to collect in person, if requested in advance, results will be sent electronically **from 11:00am** via email to your **School/chosen email account** on **Thursday 25<sup>th</sup> August 2022**.

Staff will be available in school from **8:30am** to deal with any specific exam / careers related guidance you may require.

Uncollected envelopes will be available to collect from the Main Reception following results' day.

**Before leaving the building, please ensure you have completed the Destinations Form and handed in to a member of staff. If you are returning to study in the Sixth Form, you must speak to Mrs Ledingham.**

**We would also ask all students to sign a consent form, allowing the school to request copies of exam scripts. This is not part of the appeals' process (outlined in this document), but enables departments to use model responses with students in the future. Before doing so, all scripts would be anonymised.**

## STATEMENT OF RESULTS (Example)

On results day you will receive a 'Statement of Results'. **THIS IS NOT YOUR FINAL CERTIFICATE.** The statement lists ALL the exams you have taken and any components within the qualification.

A capital letter indicates an **OVERALL** grade. Endorsement grades are listed in the last column in the format P = Pass / M = Merit / D = Distinction. For example, D2 represents a Level 2 distinction.

Those studying Combined Science GCSE will achieve 2 grades. The example below indicates 2 grade 6s.

## POST RESULTS SERVICES

### Reviews of Marking

All Reviews of Marking (ROMs) should first be discussed with the relevant Head of Department and/or Subject Teacher who will advise on the viability of such a request. The “Review of Marking Form” should then be completed and signed (Appendix B). **Payment will be required before a Review of Marking can be processed.**

In the school’s experience, it is unusual for marks to change upwards by more than a marginal amount. However, the school reviews the marks that your child and others have achieved and will advise candidates if we feel there is an anomaly and that the paper should be reviewed. If we are concerned about results received for a particular subject, the school itself will request a review of marking of all those papers (with the candidate’s consent)

**Review of Marking categories are as follows:**

<p><b>SERVICE 1 CLERICAL CHECK</b></p> <p><b>This service included the following checks:</b> That all parts of the script have been marked. The totalling of marks. The recording of marks. The application of any adjustments. The application of grade thresholds. The application of any special consideration, where applicable (indicate on form). The outcome of the re-check will be reported along with a statement of the total marks awarded for each unit/component included in the enquiry. The target for completion is within 20 calendar days of exam board receiving request.</p>
<p><b>SERVICE 2 (Mark review)</b></p> <p>This is a post-results review of the original marking to ensure that the agreed mark scheme has been applied correctly. The service is available for externally assessed components of both unitised and linear specifications.</p> <p>The deadline for completion is within 30 calendar days of the awarding body receiving the request. This service will include:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>➤ the clerical re-checks detailed in Service 1;</li> <li>➤ a review of marking as described above;</li> <li>➤ if requested, a copy of the reviewed script(s) for those units/components included as part of the Access to Scripts service. (If the nature of the unit/component is such that access to scripts cannot be arranged, such as externally assessed GCE AS and GCE A2 Modern Foreign Language Speaking tests, then a report/copy of the record sheet may be requested. Awarding bodies will advise centres of the mechanism by which reports may be requested.)</li> </ul>
<p><b>PRIORITY SERVICE 2P (Mark review)</b></p> <p>This service is as Service 2. However, it is only available if a GCE A-level candidate’s place in higher education is dependent on the outcome. Any applications not meeting these criteria will be treated as normal Service 2 requests. The deadline for completion is within 18 calendar days of the awarding body receiving the request.</p>
<p><b>ATS (Access to Script)</b></p> <p>A photocopy or the original of the student’s script.</p>

## CERTIFICATES

Certificates are received in school early November and will be available to collect from Sixth Form Reception shortly after. Those students who are going onto Sixth Form will be notified.

### **CERTIFICATES WILL NEED TO BE SIGNED FOR UPON COLLECTION.**

JCQ regulations state that certificates should be kept for 12 months. If they remain uncollected they may be disposed of securely.

Certificates are important documents. Most educational institutions and potential employers will ask to see your original certificates. If you lose or fail to collect your Certificates, you will need to obtain duplicates from the relevant Awarding Body. The Awarding Bodies no longer replicate certificates unless you can prove they were destroyed by theft, fire or flood; they will only issue a Statement of Achievement. This currently costs in the region of £40.00 per 'Statement of Achievement'.

### **Notice to Centres**

### **Unclaimed Certificates**

The Awarding Bodies have agreed to implement a standard procedure for dealing with unclaimed certificates.

Centres may destroy any unclaimed certificates by a secure method (for example by shredding or incineration) after holding them for a period of 12 months from the date of issue. A record of all certificates destroyed by a centre should be kept for a further period of four years from the date of their destruction.

Any queries concerning the destruction or secure disposal of unclaimed certificates should be directed to the awarding body that issued the certificates.

### Clerical re-checks, reviews of marking and appeals

#### Candidate consent form

##### Information for candidates

The following information explains what may happen following a clerical re-check, a review of marking and any subsequent appeal.

If your school or college submits a request for a clerical re-check or a review of the original marking, and then a subsequent appeal, for one of your examinations after your subject grade has been issued, there are three possible outcomes:

- Your original mark is lowered, so your final grade may be lower than the original grade you received.
- Your original mark is confirmed as correct, so there is no change to your grade.
- Your original mark is raised, so your final grade may be higher than the original grade you received.

To proceed with the clerical re-check or review of marking, you **must** sign the form below. This tells the head of your school or college that you have understood what the outcome might be, and that you give your consent to the clerical re-check or review of marking being submitted.

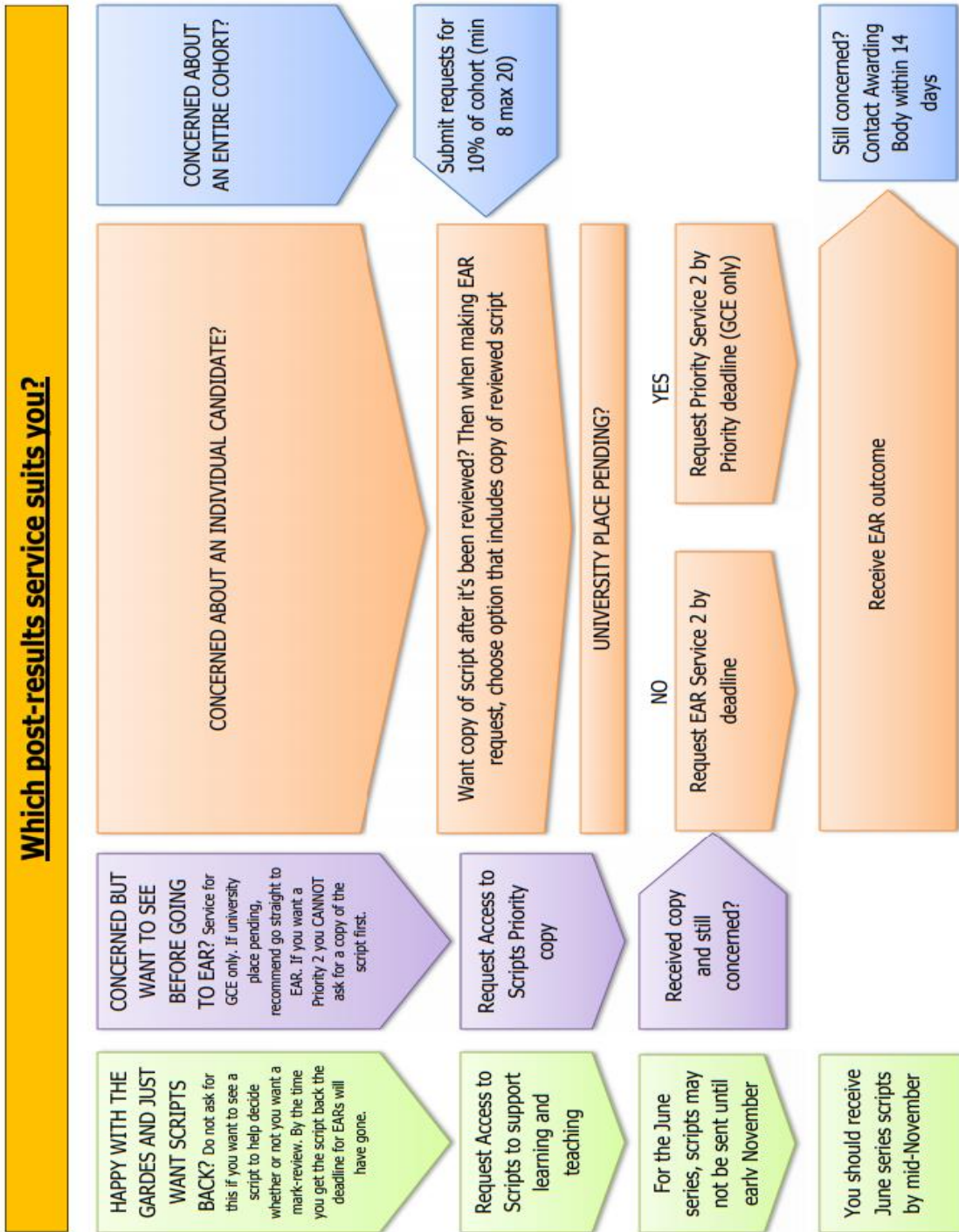
