Door Locking Mechanisms – Period 4

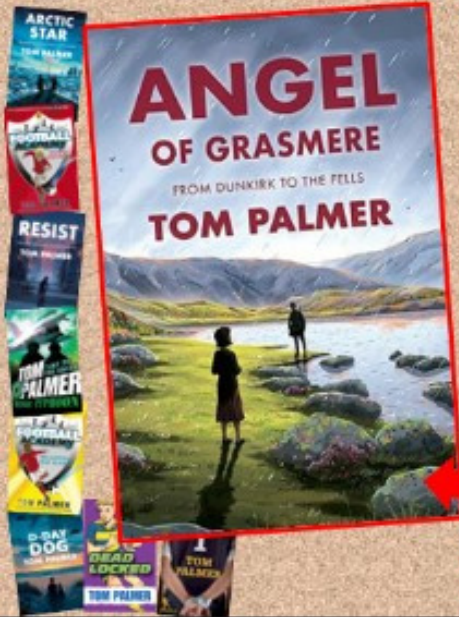
