Behaviour Curriculum

Our behaviour curriculum is designed to define what expected behaviour looks like in our school. Time is allocated to weekly, year team specific assemblies, in order that we can teach students 'how we do things around at Trinity School'.

The behaviour curriculum is centred around the **teaching** of routines and habits and is used to reinforce the behaviours expected of all students. It complements a wide variety of contributions to the teaching of behaviour, such as induction and transition sessions, practicing of key routines, student and staff bulletins and of course targeted provision for more vulnerable learners.
