Dear Parents/Carers,

Happy New Year, and welcome to the Term 2 Careers Update. We hope you and your families had a restful and enjoyable break. As we begin the new term, we are pleased to share key information, upcoming opportunities, and important guidance to support students as they continue to explore their future education and career pathways.

Careers Overview – Spring Term

Year 7-11: Lunchtime pop up one per half term- Students will have the opportunity to talk to a local employer about progression pathways and opportunities during lunchtime.

Year 7-11: Careers fortnight occurs each half term, subject staff explore a career or essential skill with each class once during the fortnight. The Careers fortnights this term are WC 9th Feb and WC 23rd March.

Year 7-10: We are excited at being able to host the BBC Bitesize Careers tour on Friday 23rd January. The presentations are led by an experienced BBC presenter, who speaks to three professionals in a 'panel-style' setup. Each professional is either from our local area or works in our local area and will discuss their career path with the host. They'll cover a variety of topics, such as relevant qualifications, personal anecdotes, advice on work experience and key soft skills for the workplace. There's also an opportunity for our students to ask questions during the interactive part of the event.

Year 7-10: In our half termly freeze sessions this term sessions will focus on National Apprenticeship week (<https://nationalapprenticeshipweek.co.uk/>) in February where students will have presentations from external providers on what apprenticeships are and opportunities that are available. Year 9: Hello Futures have been invited into assemblies this term to discuss progression routes with Y9, to explore possible next steps and allow students to ask questions about next steps. <https://www.hellofuture.ac.uk/progression-routes/>

Year 10: Work experience support from Cumbria Work experience is taking place to secure any remaining placements.

Year 11: One to one personal guidance interviews continue. Lunchtime drop-in sessions in the careers office for anyone who needs support with any applications for next steps. Gen 2 have been invited in to share their apprenticeship opportunities.
