Dear Parent/Carer

You will have heard through the media that there is an increase in the numbers of positive cases of COVID-19 both nationally and in our local area. Unfortunately, this is having an impact in school with high numbers of staff testing positive and multiple cases in school. Please be assured that we continue to keep measures in place to reduce transmission as far as possible. Key measures already in place are;

- Classroom doors and windows remain open to ensure adequate ventilation
- Students should continue to use the many sanitiser stations around school, cleaning hands regularly
- Students are encouraged to socialise outside at break and lunchtime and we continue to operate year group bubbles at social times
- Enhanced cleaning continues to be in operation

We have spoken to Public Health and they have advised that we consider reintroducing some measures to help minimise the number of people absent and to reduce the risk of further transmission.

- Staff will be asked to consider wearing masks in communal and crowded areas of the school
- We may move assemblies and other activities online in year groups where case numbers are highest
- We may need to rearrange planned trips.
- If your child is in a year group where we are seeing multiple cases, we may ask that students complete LFD testing for a short period of time. If this is the case, we will provide one pack of tests for the purpose of testing twice a week until Easter.

Please continue to be vigilant for the main symptoms of COVID-19 and if your child does display symptoms, please keep them at home and arrange for them to have a PCR test whether or not they have had COVID-19 in the past 90 days. Students should isolate for 5 days after their symptoms started, or the day they tested positive if they had no symptoms, and can return to school if they have a negative test result on two consecutive days.
